Message from Rabbi Milhander

Dear Friends,

It is hard to believe that I am in the middle of my ninth year here at TBT. During that time, we have celebrated births, b'nai mitzvah, weddings, and we have also mourned the loss of loved ones and shared tragic events in the world. I often think back to my first year here in Fullerton, which you may recall was part-time as I was still living and working in Ventura County. During that year, I would stay at the Residence Inn off of Placentia Avenue (no, this is not a paid commercial endorsement) and once in a while I would have some free time and a meal on my own. Somehow, during one of my weekends here, I was looking for a pizza place close to the hotel and I came across a small "hole-in-the-wall" joint in the shopping center on Chapman just east of Placentia.

The pizza place was squeezed between the trophy and pawn shops and the discount market. It was a small place seemingly with one employee, more than likely the owner himself. I don't remember the name of the place and unfortunately it is no longer there, but I do remember being in there, ordering my pizza, and then watching with awe the love and dedication given by the man to making my meal.

Unlike the large, super-volume, name-brand pizza providers, this man made each and every pizza with unwavering care and concern. The dough had to be perfectly placed on the baking tray. The sauce had to be completely even. Every tiny place of cheese had to be in the right place. I often thought, "Why would this man give so much attention to detail to a pizza?" But as I thought about it more, I realized that this pizza shop was much more than this man's business; making my pizza was his mission in life and he put every ounce of himself into his work.

I still remember this man, whose name I never learned, because he taught me a very important lesson: that every thing we do – no matter how seemingly insignificant – every thing we do truly matters. Every phone call, every hospital visit, every service I conduct and every sermon I deliver, every moment of every day – it all really and truly matters. In the hustle and bustle of daily life this lesson is easy to forget. It is sometimes much easier to "phone it in," to pretend that what we do or say is insignificant, doesn't really matter, unimportant, irrelevant, and can't make a difference. We are, after all, only a speck of sand; our lives are only a moment in endless time.

It would have been much easier and faster, I am sure, for the man to be sloppy and careless with my pizza. I'm sure the taste would have been just the same. But there was something else involved. When he handed me the pizza box, I could feel and see the sense of pride in his eyes. Whatever the taste, good or bad, he knew and I knew that he put every ounce of himself into crafting that product, and for that I was most appreciative and always walked away in amazement and with much admiration.

The Torah, as we all know, contains many lessons for life. It is the structure around which we Jews build our lives. But there are lessons that can also be learned from the simple actions of others, from those who seek nor want any special attention or gratitude, who go about their business and live their lives with internal pride and attention to detail. Such people can also teach us important and invaluable lessons.

I want to take just a moment to express my gratitude to the Men's Club for nominating me as TBT's Man of the Year. (Mazal tov to Lisa Brass for being named Neshot Tikvah's Woman of the Year!) I will receive my award at a regional dinner of the Men of Reform Judaism on February 20th. I know many of you will be there to honor me and for that I am also extremely grateful. My dedication and devotion to the Men's Club and to the Temple goes far beyond my employee status. TBT is my family's congregation as well. It is where we raise our children and where we share our joys and our pain. The past 9+ years have been truly wonderful and I look forward to many, many more years as your spiritual leader and your friend.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Shalom,

This is the time of year the TBT Board of Directors begins planning for the next fiscal year that begins on June 1, 2010. Soon the finance committee will begin working on our overall budget. The Director of each office will make plans for what they hope to accomplish next year and project their budget needs. Each office plays a vital role in the governance of our Temple. My sincerest thanks go to all our Directors who have volunteered their time and effort towards that goal. Your efforts have made TBT a better place and those efforts have made my job much easier.

Now is the time we begin the process of selecting candidates for election to next year's Board of Directors (BOD). The process begins with a nominating committee chosen from the BOD and the general membership. All officers are elected for a one year term and can serve, if re-elected, for a maximum of three years. The nominating committee begins by canvassing the present BOD to find out which officers, if eligible, would like to continue in their position. Then the nominating committee looks to the general membership to find qualified candidates for open positions. Any congregant may make it known that they wish to be considered for a position on the BOD. The nominating committee will then recommend to the BOD a slate of officers. If the slate is approved, then it will be voted on at the May congregational meeting. If there are other eligible candidates who wish to serve as an officer, then their name will also appear on a ballot at the May meeting. Remember, any congregant in good standing can run for any office.

I mentioned above that the nominating committee looks for "qualified" candidates. So what makes a candidate qualified? The overwhelming quality needed is an enthusiastic wish to make TBT a better place and willingness to volunteer time and effort towards that goal. Some offices need Directors with certain skills, but I assure you there is a place on the BOD, or on a committee, or on a specific project, or in some other capacity for anyone that wishes to contribute a little of their time to help with the continued success of our Temple. It is my experience that the rewards of volunteering far outweigh the cost of your time. Please let the TBT office or the nominating committee know of your interest in serving.

I have been involved with a committee for almost two years that has been reviewing our Constitution and By-Laws. It had not been reviewed for over ten years and I realized that there were a number of instances where our current actions were different than what was required in the By-Laws. On some issues the By-Laws need to be changed and on some issues the BOD needs to change what they do. The discussions involved in this exercise have been absolutely fascinating. Excluding me, the committee consists of some of the most brilliant and thoughtful minds in our Temple. Sam Prum, Kathy Sapiro, Cindy Jacobson, Elaine Socol and Miriam Van Raalte have spent dozens and dozens of hours in meetings and in research at their homes. Each item has been looked at from various perspectives before any recommendations were suggested. Although it sounds like a cliché, words cannot express my gratitude for their collective efforts.



The recommended changes will be presented to the Board of Directors over the next two months. If approved, those recommendations will be presented to the congregation for discussion in April and May in a Town Hall format. You will then be asked to vote for the proposed changes at the May Congregational meeting.

This news has sent a bolt of excitement and anticipation through FIES and its many supporters.

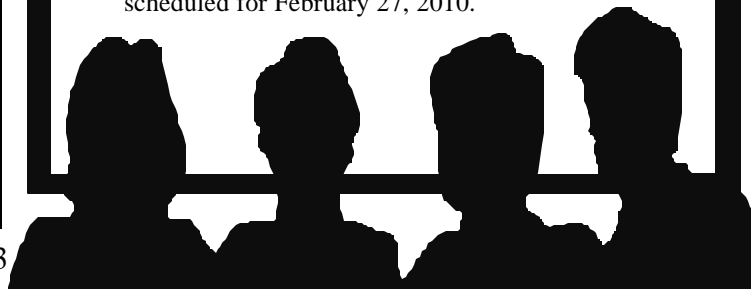

Do you ever wonder what your children will remember years from now when they think back on their childhoods? As the director of our Religious School, I wonder what your children will remember as memorable experiences from their Jewish education when they come back as adults.



On Saturday, January 23, our students participated in a 3.5 mile walkathon to benefit Project Legacy as well as *Soles for Souls*, an organization that recycles worn rubber-soled shoes. PROJECT LEGACY UPDATE

Asa Center in Construction Phase

By the time you read this article, you should have received the mailing regarding the opportunity to participate in our exciting addition to the Asa Learning Center. Our Holocaust Memorial! Thank you to the TBT Men's Club who first came up with the idea and have started the project off with a donation of \$12,500. Also thanks to Neshot Tikvah (Sisterhood) for matching them with another \$12,500.

The Legacy Committee has voted to go ahead with this enhancement to our project's scope but we still need more contributions to make it happen. The Memorial will be in the new courtyard, west of the new building and directly across from the sanctuary lobby entrance. The design is a result of a collaboration headed by our own temple member and artist, Leslye Prum. It is quite unique and will be the only one of its kind in our Orange County community. We hope that it will be a place of Remembrance and Learning for children and adults to never forget the despicable events that occurred during the Holocaust. We have set a deadline for the 15th of March for participation because we want to get the design of the remembrance recognition wall under way. When you are at the temple, check out the model made by Joe Bloomfield to help you get a prospective of it's scope and beauty.

The building plans are back with the City of Fullerton for what we hope is the final check and approval. As soon as we receive our building permits then we can go forward with footings, structure, etc. By next month we should be seeing more action in the "big dig". We are look for a July completion and are planning our "grand-opening" for late August.

For those of you who have been procrastinating or undecided on participation, NOW is your time to step forward. We are still short \$185,000 in pledges to complete the project and be debt free in five years. Also, matching funds are still available. Make sure your names are on the donor walls, with ours, to be part of this important Legacy for our community and for those who will follow after us.
